



Hornet National Championships 2019

Notice of Race

17th to 20th August 2019

Organised by Stone Sailing Club in association with the RYA National Hornet Class Association

1. RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and: The rules of the RYA National Hornet Association
Except as any of these are changed by the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2. Competitors must enter on the forms provided and pay the appropriate entry fee.
- 1.3. For the duration of the regatta Competitors are temporary members of Stone Sailing Club and will be subject to the rules of the club.
- 1.4. Stone Sailing Club implements the RYA Racing Charter which requires competitors to sail and organizer's to provide racing in compliance with the Charter, which can be found at the front of the RYA Racing Rules of Sailing 2017 – 2020.

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority and the Class Association.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1. The Hornet National Championship is open to all boats of the National Hornet class.
- 3.2. Either the Helm or Crew must be a full adult or full junior member of the RYA National Hornet Class Association.
- 3.3. Enter by completing an entry form, available from the National Hornet Class Association or the Stone Sailing Club web sites.

4. FEES

- 4.1. Required fees are as follows:
 - 4.1.1. Adult sailors: £190.00 per boat.
 - 4.1.2. Juniors (helm and crew under 21 on 11th August) reduced entry fee: £118.00 per boat.
 - 4.1.3. Competitors who live outside the UK pay for social events only: £94.00 per boat.

4.2. The entry fee includes the following social events for both helm and crew:

Saturday evening: One Course Supper (TBA)
Sunday evening: Roast Dinner
Monday evening: 3 Course Championship Dinner

4.3. Additional tickets for social events are available to buy when entering and at registration:

Saturday evening: One Course Supper (TBA), £10 per extra ticket
Sunday evening: Roast Dinner, £10 per extra ticket
Monday evening: 3 Course Championship Dinner, £22 per extra ticket

5. SCHEDULE

5.1. Registration will take place in the bar on the 1st floor of the clubhouse, as follows:

Friday 16th August: from 19.00 to 21.00
Saturday 17th August: from 09.00 to 11.00

5.2. There will be a briefing for competitors by the course board at the front of clubhouse on Saturday 17th August at 10.30.

5.3. Schedule of races:

Saturday 17 th August	2 races, sailed back-to-back	First warning signal 12.25	14.50 (H)
Sunday 18 th August	3 races, sailed back-to-back	First warning signal 11.25	09.00 (L)
Monday 19 th August	3 races, sailed back-to-back	First warning signal 11.25	09.30 (L)
Tuesday 20 th August	2 races, sailed back-to-back	First warning signal 11.25	10.00 (L)

5.4. There are 10 races scheduled.

5.5. When more than one race is scheduled for the same day, the warning signal for each succeeding race will be made as soon as practicable. To alert boats that another race or sequence of races will begin soon, the postponement signal will be displayed for at least four minutes before the warning signal is displayed.

5.6. One extra race per day may be sailed, provided it results in the series being no more than one race ahead of schedule.

5.7. No starting signal will be made after 15:00 hrs on the last day of racing.

5.8. Schedule of social activities and catering:

Friday evening: Food and drink available in clubhouse
Saturday daytime: Breakfast 08.30 – 10.00, lunch from 12.00, bar open all day
Saturday evening: One Course Supper (TBA), (ticket required)
Sunday daytime: Breakfast 08.30 – 10.00, lunch from 12.00, bar open all day
Sunday evening: Roast Dinner (ticket required) followed by AGM
Monday daytime: Breakfast 08.30 – 10.00, lunch from 12.00, bar open all day
Monday evening: 3 Course Championship Dinner (ticket required)
Tuesday daytime: Breakfast 08.30 – 10.00, lunch from 12.00, bar open all day
Tuesday after sailing: Food available.

6. MEASUREMENT

- 6.1. Before a boat is eligible to race, her current, valid measurement certificate may be required to be presented at the Race Office or its existence verified.
- 6.2. A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions. On the water, a boat can be instructed by a race committee measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.
- 6.3. All boats shall sail under their registered class number. Only pre-measured sails that have been inspected for the event and stamped shall be used. 2 Jibs, 2 Mains and 2 Spinnakers only may be presented for registration.
- 6.4. Subject to the written permission of the Race Committee a boat chartered or borrowed for the event may declare at the time of entry or registration a sail number to be displayed on all sails used in the regatta which may be different from the number of the boat as stated on the measurement certificate provided that this declared number shall not be the sail number of any other boat competing in the regatta.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 7.1. A printed copy of the Sailing Instructions will be available upon completion of registration at Stone Sailing Club, having satisfied the Eligibility and Entry Requirements.

8. VENUE

- 8.1. The venue is Stone Sailing Club (SSC), Tinnocks Lane, St. Lawrence Bay, Essex, CM0 7NF.
- 8.2. All cars must be parked in the Club Car Park.
- 8.3. Camping, by prior permission, is available on site free of charge from the evening of Friday 16th August. Please contact Caroline Crispin, Club Secretary, to book. Telephone: +44 (0)1621 828108, or email: csbstonesc@hotmail.co.uk. Campers have access to the changing room toilets and showers 24 hours a day.

- 8.5. The racing area is in the River Blackwater to the East of the clubhouse.

9. THE COURSE

- 9.1. The diagram in Attachment A shows the course, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 10.** The races will be managed to last 60-75 minutes for the first boat to finish. A different time (shorter or longer) used to complete the race will not be ground for protest. This changes rule 35 and Appendix A4.1
RRS.SCORING

- 10.1. Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a Championship series.
- 10.2. (a) When fewer than four races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
(b) When from four to six races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores, excluding her worst score.
(c) When seven or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores, excluding her two worst scores.

11. SUPPORT BOATS

- 11.1. Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first start until all boats have finished or retired or the Race Committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.
- 11.2. Support boats may be requested to assist the race committee with rescue duties and shall monitor VHF channel P1 at all times whilst afloat.

12. RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 12.1. Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile phones.

13. PRIZES

- 13.1. Overall prizes will be awarded to helm and crew for the first six places.
- 13.2. Trophies, daily prizes and novelty prizes will be awarded according to a list to be published by the Class Association.
- 13.3. Daily prizes will be presented in the clubhouse bar at 21.00 each evening.
- 13.4. The Championship prize giving will take place as soon as possible after the completion of racing on Tuesday 20th August.

14. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 14.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk, see RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

14.2. RISK STATEMENT

Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: “The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or continue racing is hers alone.” Sailing is by nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure to themselves, their crew, their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of a patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

15. INSURANCE

- 15.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.
